Session Overview	A basic understanding of business financials is critical for entrepreneurs to be able to effectively manage their business. Financials provide the basis for capital raising and developing investor pitches. Many startups fail because the entrepreneur simply can't manage the financials effectively and don't recognize the need to raise capital soon enough. They don't track the "burn rate" of the company and simply run out of cash. Understanding basic financial spreadsheets and forecasts will reduce the chance of failure.
