### Responding to chemical spills

A minor spill does not threaten the safety of nearby individuals. To handle it,


- Notify the people around you
- Wear PPE and stop the spill with absorbant materials in the spill kit
- Dispose of absorbants, decontamination equipment, spill material, etc. as hazardous waste through the EH&S chemical waste pickup request (online)

A major spill is an immediate danger to people around you or may cause fire or explosion. Call EH&S!

- Notify and evacuate all nearby people
- Activate the fire alarm
- Isolate the work space by placing a sign: "Do not enter – chemical spill"
- Business hours: call EH&S (352) 392-8400
- After business hours: call UPD (352) 392-1111


#### **BMS Building Evacuation**
